CITY COUNCIL NEWS

At the monthly meeting of the Mondamin City Council on July 7, 2025, New Business began with a resolution for the appointment of new council member, Lacie Rife. Thank you, Lacie, for being willing to serve your community in this capacity. Former council member Chad Wilson had resigned due to his work schedule conflicts. Thank you, Chad, for your service the last few years.

Other new business items dealt with approving the renewal for a liquor license for Jiffy Mart, a Heritage Day summary and approving the booking of Stars and Bars Entertainment bounce houses for the June 13, 2026, Heritage Day celebration. The council discussed weed control methods at the new water treatment plant property. Discussion was held about purchasing items for the maintenance department. The employee evaluation committee gave its recommendations for the city employees.

After the usual department reports, John Harrison gave his updates on renovation progress at 401 Cedar and other properties. Nuisance letters have been sent to various property owners about the conditions on

their properties that are in violation of city or state codes.

Under Old Business the council received an update on the tree inventory of diseased trees on city property. Bids will be discussed at future meetings this fall. Then the council was informed about the scheduled maintenance for the city's water tower which will be taking place.

The council went into closed session following the Chapter 21.5 of the Code of Iowa guidelines to discuss selling of real estate at 107 S. Main St. No action was taken because bids must be taken first.

The next city council meeting will be August 4, 2025, at 7:00 p.m. in city hall.

Mondamin's annual celebration was well attended on June 14. The breakfast at the Church of Christ got Saturday's festivities off to a great start by serving 93 people and collecting \$674 for the West Harrison Ministerial Alliance emergency fund.

The Heritage Day parade, "Hooray for the Red, White, and Blue," started at 10:30 with many entries. Winning 1st place in the parade was Randy Stolz of Missouri Valley, 2nd place went to Holy Family Catholic Church of Mondamin, 3rd place was earned by Bob Tedford of Pisgah, and the 4th place winner was John Henry of Logan.

Following the parade, activities began in the Mondamin City Park with the popular dunk tank, games sponsored by the Loess Hills

Lancers, six bounce houses, Lolipop dah Clown, Sarah Epperson painting faces, delicious desserts provide by K-Kids and Builder's Club, sandwiches made by the Jiffy Mart crew, a number of vendors selling their wares, raffle tickets available for some great prizes, a horseshoe tournament, and the first-ever Heritage Day pie eating contest.

United State Post Office in Mondamin has Made Recent Changes.

Not only did the price of U.S. stamps recently increase to \$.78 on July 13, but so did the cost of postal boxes, international postage, post office box rent, and all other postal services.

One of the biggest changes for Mondamin customers is that mail put in the blue box in front of the post office will have mail picked up for delivery at 11:15 a.m. each day. (There is NO late afternoon pick up.) All mail put in the inside slots (LOCAL or OUT OF TOWN) will be picked up at 11:30 a.m. instead of 4:30 p.m. like it has been in the past.

Postal Clerk, Danyell Peasley, advises that if you want your letter to go out on the day you mail it, you must get it to the post office prior to 11:30 a.m. Mail placed in the outside box or the inside slots after 11:30 a.m. won't go out until the following day.

The 11:30 a.m. pick up time is for Monday – Friday. On Saturday the deadline is 8:45

a.m. in the outside box and 9:00 a.m. in the inside slots.

SUSTAINABLE SANCTUARY

2348 Loess Hills Trail

Missouri Valley, IA

“What is all that construction that is going on along Loess Hills Trail (Hwy 183)?” You may have heard this question asked many times in the past year or so. There have been many speculations as to what is being built there; some of the ideas were pretty humorous. Just south of the Loess Hills Lavender Farm, at 2348 Loess Hills Trail, you will find the home of a new business called **Sustainable Sanctuary**. This name was chosen for this farm store because the owners want to raise food that will sustain

themselves and the community. The owners are Erin and Mike McAtee and their daughter, Alyssa, who currently live in Omaha. Their sons, Jayden and Keegan, are there to help with the heavy lifting. She commented to a customer that they started backward in their building plans. They started building the business shops and green houses before they built their house. The owners of this Iowa-Nebraska farm store offer home grown vegetables, chicken, and eggs. They raise their own vegetables with some grown indoors to control exposure from pests or weather. Erin said that she has raised vegetables indoors for ten years. She is in the process of combining her businesses in the Omaha area and transitioning them to be located at the Sanctuary. Other products that are available are from primarily Iowa growers or contracted producers; some use ingredients produced in Nebraska. Products that are currently available through the farm store are dressings, spices, dairy products such as Jisa cheeses, jellies and jams, meat, chickens, eggs, beef, SmokeHouse summer sausage and jerky, baked goods from Breeze Bakery in Council Bluffs, and a favorite, Roberto's Pizza from Des Moines.

The fifty meat chickens and the three hundred egg-laying hens raised on site are fed organic feed. Some of the fruit products are grown at Deal's Orchard in Jefferson, IA. At this time, bins are stocked with Black Diamond and Green watermelons from Missouri and Iowa, cantaloupe, tomatoes, potatoes, sweet corn, cucumbers, yellow

squash, onions and Pink Lady apples, fresh strawberries, and Colorado peaches.

When Erin was asked why they chose to locate their business in the Loess Hills, she explained they had looked at sites in Nebraska first, but chose Loess Hills Trail because it is pretty, quiet, less populated than other areas, and the land was available. They want to bring healthy products and open up opportunities for the area communities. She said this is a central location for many of the Harrison County's towns.

One future goal for their business is to have a farm-to-table restaurant on their property. In the three months since Sustainable Sanctuary has opened, business has steadily increased mostly by word of mouth from local customers who have stopped by and visitors who have come to view the Hills. A few people have been lost due to incorrect GPS directions. They stop to get directions at the store and end up shopping!

Sheriff Cross came to Mondamin last Thursday and raided the Carl Jackson home and allegedly found seven gallons of home brew in a bathtub on ice. Jackson was not at home so on Friday Marshal Bellville accompanied him to Logan where Judge H. J. Mantz fined him \$300.

Brothers Admit Theft of Chickens

Ernest and August Tippery unable to furnish Bond, Committed to Jail

Ernest Tippery, 24, and August Tippery, 19, brothers living west of Mondamin, at a preliminary hearing in Justice of the Peace J. M. Davis' court here Tuesday morning admitted theft of sixteen chickens from Amos Bothwell. Unable to furnish \$500 bond each, they were committed to the county jail.

The youths were arrested at Mondamin Monday evening by Sheriff C. F. Cross. Mr. Bothwell who filed the complaint against the Tiperlys said that 32 chickens had been stolen from his place. In court the Tiperlys said that they sold the 16 stolen chickens in Missouri Valley.


